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SLIDE: CALEDONIA: AN ILLEGAL PEACEKEEPING MISSION ON CANADIAN SOIL

SLIDE: CALEDONIA VICTIMS PROJECT LOGO

The image of the dancer in the Caledonia Victims Project logo is a tribute to a 14 year old girl named Pam Dudych who loved to dance – before her world turned upside down. [x]

SLIDE: DANCER AT LIONS PARK, OCT 08/07

Pam lives on the Sixth Line in Caledonia. The OPP withdrew policing service from her street on April 20, 2006 after hundreds of native occupiers attacked them while they were trying to enforce a court order.

Police were injured after being attacked with clubs, crowbars, axes, a chainsaw and socks filled with rocks. [x]

SLIDE: SAM GUALTIERI

So far native protesters have burned down a bridge and threatened to kill firefighters; attacked an elderly couple in their car; attacked journalists; assaulted and threatened residents, police and one another; destroyed the area's hydro station; thrown a vehicle over a bridge; blocked the town's main roads and rail lines; attempted to murder a police officer; polluted the environment with tire and grass fires; extorted money from non-native land owners; and left a builder with permanent brain damage after beating him nearly to death in the home he was building for his daughter. We have 1,000+ hours of audio recordings of radio transmissions in our possession proving that native occupiers had also authorized the shooting of civilians and police, among other depravities.

SLIDE: 'ROAD OF HOPE' PAMPHELET

We first met Pam Dudych and her family in March 2007. She had produced a heartbreaking pamphlet for a school project called, *Road of Hope: Help the Sixth Line!* and wanted the world to hear her words of pain, so we took her to Queen's Park to share her story at a news conference.

SLIDE: DEER CARCASSES ON POLE

Pam's mother showed me the pass natives forced them to carry, as well as a photo of two of the seven deer carcasses hung by occupiers on a lamp pole near their home between October and December 2006 where kids on the school bus could see them.

Her diary entry for October 30th at 3:50 pm notes this about the 5th carcass: "Between yesterday at 1:30 and now, the deer was taken down, skinned and beheaded and then hung back up. Mayor called." Her mom wrote me saying, "See[ing] the deer each time gave you a sickening feeling in your gut."

SLIDE: VAN PUSHED OVER BRIDGE, FIRE BELOW

Another Caledonia resident asked me to share one of his experiences:

"The police and firemen were hiding behind my fence while a group of natives (terrorists)!! were lighting a fire behind my house. They said to my neighbour and myself we cannot protect you or touch them. [...] We were and are still treated as shit by the police. My trust in our system is gone forever." [X]

OPP testimony at the trial for the Brown-Chatwell lawsuit which was heard - and later cited - by Christie Blatchford in *Helpless* confirms that the Haldimand commander was ordered *not* to arrest rioting natives whom he said were emboldened by the lack of police response. [X]

SLIDE: TIRE FIRE

Residents were forced to stand guard one night at the home of a 92 year old World War Two veteran named Jack Dancy because OPP officers refused to stop native occupiers from throwing rocks at his house. This war hero later showed me one of the rocks and tearfully told me, "I spent 5 years in hell for this country and now I don't even know if the police will protect me. It wasn't worth it." [X]

SLIDE: YOUTHS W/CLUBS, MASKS

In 2010 Pam's mother shared her feelings about the return of the OPP to the Sixth Line -- four years after they were abandoned by their police:

We have lost 4 years of our lives which we will never get back. [...] I feel like Canada has let us down big time. For a land that is supposed to be free, we are prisoners of war who have been left to deal with this predicament on our own. [...]As for policing back down here, yes it's true. Do we feel any safer - NO.

SLIDE: JEFF PARKINSON IN HOSPITAL, GARY MCHALE IN HOSPITAL

SLIDE: FANTINO SHARES JOKE W/POWLESS

After Gary McHale was sent to hospital in December 2007 the former OPP commissioner Julian Fantino was photographed sharing a joke with the native man who led the attack, but he refused Mayor Trainer's September 2009 request to meet with Sixth Line residents, which would have included Pam Dudych's family. [X, X]

SLIDE: ARRESTS OF BO CHAUSSE, RANDY FLEMING, GARY MCHALE, MARK VANDERMAAS

Four non-natives were arrested under Fantino's watch for trying to raise a Canadian flag near the occupation site. [X]

In Mr. McHale's case the OPP repeatedly targeted him for defamation and false arrests, a campaign that resulted in charges of Obstructing Justice against the now-present commissioner Chris Lewis and a superintendent, and a charge of Influencing Municipal Official against Fantino.[X]

SLIDE: CAUGHT IN THE MIDDLE

It is difficult to convey to you the absolute terror, hopelessness, trauma and sense of betrayal the people of Caledonia feel to this day. Perhaps it is enough to tell you that Pam Dudych must take medication and go to counselling; Pam's mother takes medication for her diagnosis of post traumatic stress disorder and has attempted suicide; Pam's father has had a heart attack; the family business is in ruins, and they cannot leave because they cannot sell their home. [X]

SLIDE: KKK SIGN MONTAGE W/SAM GUALTIERI, BRIDGE FIRE

This sign is from the Stirling Street subdivision where native occupiers burned down the bridge, and left Sam Gualtieri with brain damage from their vicious beating. [X]

The words 'heartless' and 'cruel' seem inadequate to describe the irony of a situation wherein an organized group from one race of people terrorized others with racial slurs, fire, violence, vandalism, and property seizures and then tormented their victims with false accusations of being white supremacists.

SLIDE: NAZI SYMBOL PAINTED ON RESIDENT'S HOME

As the son of parents who lived in Nazi-occupied Holland I am offended to the very core of my being by the blaming of innocent victims for racially-motivated crimes committed against them.

SLIDE: MERLYN W/SIGN - 'TWO TIER JUSTICE VICTIMIZES NATIVE PEOPLE TOO'

I am also offended that Six Nations people have been unintended victims of the same racist policing policies that allow illegal occupations to escalate and the sites to become lawless 'home-free zones' – as residents in both Caledonia and Ipperwash refer to them. Occupation sites have seen rapes, assaults, arson, drug use and gun violence. [X]

[SLIDE: CALEDONIA: A NATIONAL SECURITY ISSUE

Caledonia is also a national security issue. While the OPP and Ontario government have repeatedly attacked the character of law abiding non-native activists, they have never informed the public that native criminals are being aided by anarchists, radical unionists and anti-Israel groups sympathetic to organizations such as Hamas and Hezbollah.

SLIDE: TOM KEEFER

Tom Keefer of CUPE 3903 - with help from other locals from CUPE; CAW; OPSEU; CEP and USW - began supporting militants in Caledonia after the failed OPP raid of April 20/06 when police were driven off the occupation site after being attacked with weapons. [X]

By this time, according to OPP testimony at the Brown-Chatwell trial, the Caledonia occupation site was taken over by the Mohawk Warriors which police considered to be "akin to the Hell's Angels" -- a group which was involved in organized crime, cigarette running, with a reputation for physical confrontation and access to guns, including assault rifles. [X]

SLIDE: MOHAWK WARRIORS TAKE CHARGE OF CALEDONIA LAWLESSNESS

The Warriors murdered Quebec Police Corporal Marcel Lemay in Oka and they were in Ipperwash during the violent takeover of the Canadian Forces base there which led to the death of Dudley George and years of intimidation of residents. [X, X]

Tom Keefer and CUPE work with various radical groups including the Anarchist Black Cross Federation and Freedonia anarchist foundation. [X]

Freedonia has given money to several groups that work with CUPE 3903 to support the lawlessness in the Haldimand Tract, including a Caledonia-based group named Community Friends headed by Jan Watson who received funds in 2008. [x]

[SLIDE: PALESTINIAN FLAG W/WARRIOR FLAG ON DCE]

Within two weeks of the beginning of the occupation of the Douglas Creek Estates members of McMaster University's Solidarity for Palestinian Human Rights were on the site. They were there on May 03, 2006 when the Niagara Palestinian Association raised the Palestinian flag along with the Six Nations and Mohawk Warriors flag.

Jamila Ghaddar, a spokesperson for McMaster's SPHR who was on the occupation site when the Palestinian flag was raised, was also a guest speaker at a Toronto protest organized by the Coalition Against Israeli Apartheid – a group that sent delegates to the 2007 Cairo Conference to meet representatives of Hamas, Hezbollah and the Muslim Brotherhood. SLIDE: TORONTO CUPE, STEELWORKERS ON DCE 2007

SLIDE: CANADIAN FLAG UPSIDE DOWN W/LOCAL 1005 BANNER

Make no mistake about it: Caledonia is the front line for extreme left wing radicals who are using native crime groups as proxies for their own anti-capitalist, anarchist mission to undermine the rule of law in Canada. According to MPP Toby Barrett communities within the Haldimand Tract have suffered an estimated \$4.1 billion – with a 'B' – dollars in economic losses due to the native lawlessness they have supported. SLIDE: ILLEGAL PEACEKEEPING MISSION ON CANADIAN SOIL

Now let's talk about Ontario's illegal peacekeeping mission on Canadian soil. The Ipperwash Inquiry includes four recommendations which suggest the OPP, other police forces and the Minister of Community Safety & Correctional Services enact so-called 'peacekeeping' policing policies during aboriginal disputes. [x]

Both the Premier of Ontario and the former Commissioner of the OPP have referred to the OPP role in Caledonia as being that of 'peacekeepers.' On May 02, 2007 the Premier actually joked on TV about having to issue blue helmets to the OPP.' [x, x]

SLIDES: UN PHOTOS 1-10 (SELF-RUNNING)

The obscenity of this joke is underscored when one reviews a list of countries where UN peacekeepers are currently deployed: Liberia; Ivory Coast; Haiti; Sudan; Lebanon; East Timor; Darfur; Kosovo; Chad; and the Congo. [x]

Article 9 of the United Nations Millennium Declaration, a resolution adopted by the General Assembly in 2000 states, in part:

We resolve therefore: To strengthen respect for the rule of law in international as in national affairs...

The UN says this about the role of peacekeeping in restoring the Rule of Law in failed states:

Laws need to be publicly promulgated, equally enforced and independently adjudicated and be consistent with international human rights norms and standards. Peacekeeping works to strengthen police, justice and corrections institutions, as well as the institutions that can hold them accountable. [x]

Obviously, then, peacekeeping missions are *not* deployed to undermine the rule of law in stable democracies by withholding law enforcement protection from innocent civilians to appease armed aggressors of a favoured race.

Strangely, not one politician – Conservative or otherwise - has ever thought to ask some seemingly-obvious questions:

1. Does the Ontario government have the authority to deploy a peacekeeping mission on Canadian soil?
2. What legal authority exists for substituting a peacekeeping policy in place of the legal protections of the Charter of Rights and Ontario's Police Services Act during any land claim, let alone one the federal government has already declared invalid?
3. If the Ontario/OPP peacekeeping mission is illegal (and I would argue that it most certainly is), why has the federal government failed to take steps to end it?

Now, let's take a brief look at the dangerously-flawed process used by the Ipperwash Inquiry to arrive at its peacekeeping recommendations. It is commonly believed that the Ipperwash Inquiry studied how to prevent violence during land claims, a reasonable assumption given it was sitting during the height of the violence in Caledonia. Unfortunately, it did not.

[SLIDE: IPPERWASH INQUIRY COVER]

The inquiry only examined how to prevent police violence against native protesters; it *did not* allow the issue of native violence against innocent Ipperwash residents to be studied even though they were victims of a vexatious land claim against their homes filed in 1992 which marked the beginning of a reign of terror similar to that waged against Caledonia. [x, x]

Despite their nightmare, out of 139 witnesses at the Ipperwash Inquiry not one resident was allowed to testify. During the three years the inquiry was in session non-natives were granted a mere 90 minutes with the Commissioner which took place at a single townhall meeting on June 21, 2006 at the height of the violence in Caledonia – and the minutes of that meeting were sanitized.

This is why, out of 100 recommendations *not one* is specifically directed at the prevention of native violence against innocent residents. [x]

SLIDE: CALEDONIA: WAS THE CONSERVATIVE PARTY OF CANADA FRIEND OR FOE TO VICTIMS?

I would like to preface my final set of remarks by saying that I have voted for the Conservative Party all my adult life. In fact, the only party I have ever been a member of was the Reform Party under Preston Manning.

As someone who has volunteered four and a half years of my life to working towards ending race-based policing in Ontario and as someone who holds conservative values I am compelled to ask a question during this election:

What were Diane Finley and the Harper government doing while the Ontario government was undermining Canada's Charter of Rights and our precious rule of law during the past 5 years?

SLIDE: HAS ANYONE SEEN DIANE FINLEY?

This picture from Gary McHale's 2006 March for Freedom shows a resident carrying a sign that was posted around Caledonia to convey the sentiments about their MP's lack of interest. It says, "Has anyone seen Diane Finley?"

Diane Finley has brushed off Doug Fleming's attempts to meet with her to discuss the blight of illegal smokeshacks in his community. She has so far rejected *our* attempts to set up a meeting to talk about Caledonia issues.

However, according to Jan Watson of Community Friends – you remember – the group that supports the lawlessness in Caledonia, the one that received anarchist funding? Watson says that Finley DID meet with her.

On December 31, 2009 a Superior Court judge ruled that former OPP Commissioner Julian Fantino should face a criminal charge of Influencing Municipal Officials for allegedly intimidating Haldimand Council.

In her 2010 book *Helpless: Caledonia's Nightmare of Fear and Anarchy, And How The Law Failed All of Us*, Christie Blatchford stated her opinion that Fantino had “sold frontline officers down the river.” The book exposed not only the breakdown of the rule of law, but Fantino's key role in enforcing racial policing, and his willingness to use his office to try to silence those who spoke out against Caledonia's policing nightmare.

In September 2010, before *Helpless* was published, we began to hear rumours we could scarcely believe that Stephen Harper was going to appoint Fantino as a Conservative candidate. I posted evidence about Fantino's record online and sent links out to all my contacts, including Diane Finley's office. No response.

On October 3rd I happened to meet a very senior official at the national level of the Conservative Party of Canada at an unrelated event. I begged him to wait until after Blatchford's book was released before nominating Fantino, and offered to meet with party officials to provide evidence and answer questions. My offer was not accepted.

Retired RCMP sergeant Bill Dietz from Caledonia wrote a letter to Diane Finley in which he said the Fantino nomination was a “middle finger to every citizen who wishes for decency and the rule of law and order.”

After Harper appointed Fantino as a cabinet minister his government announced a \$10 million dollar grant to a private group which has two of Fantino's fundraisers as prime backers of a planned hospital in his riding.

The Conservative platform says the Harper government wants to “help Canadians feel safe in their homes and in their communities.” Why then, did they stay silent for five years while Pam Dudych's family and the Rauscher family and the Brown-Chatwell family and the Gualtieri family and many others were being denied police protection?

SLIDE: REDWIRE

In 2010 we discovered a native supremacist magazine called Redwire had received \$1.2 million in federal funding and was to receive more even though it had published specific instructions to help native youth conduct terror and sabotage operations against non-natives. Where is the Conservative plan to end taxpayer-funded hate and terror training projects directed at native youth like this?

The Conservative platform talks about “advancing the rule of law, and human rights” in Afghanistan, a noble goal, but what about restoring the rule of law and protecting human rights at home in Haldimand County? Where is the plan for that?

The Conservative platform talks about supporting the victims of crime, yet it appointed a candidate and minister who snubbed Caledonia’s non-native victims, but repeatedly met with the native criminals who terrorized them and their town. How could the party play such a cruel joke?

Unfortunately, rewarding Julian Fantino’s contribution to Caledonia’s misery was not the end of the party’s contempt for victims.

SLIDE: NATIONAL POST – NO APOLOGY TO WARRIORS

In December 2010 the Harper government announced that it was planning to apologize to the Mohawk Warrior crime group because the Canadian Forces listed it as a potential adversary in an anti-insurgency manual. The same organization that murdered Corporal Lemay in Oka, and then went on to terrorize Ipperwash and Caledonia is to be rewarded by the Stephen Harper government with an official apology from the Canadian Armed Forces.

SLIDE: CALEDONIA: CRIMES AGAINST DEMOCRACY

Caledonia’s illegal peackeeping mission, to me, represents a massive crime against democracy that was committed under the very noses of Diane Finley, Stephen Harper and the Conservative Party of Canada who all turned blind eyes to the suffering of innocent people, and the violation of their rights under the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms.

SLIDE: HAS ANYONE SEEN DIANE FINLEY?

I do not want to destroy the Conservative Party of Canada – the country needs a strong conservative voice. But, I suggest to you that what the party needs most right now, in THIS election, is a short term lesson for the long term good.

That lesson is that political parties WILL pay a price for standing idly by when police protection is denied to Canadian citizens.
